Aspiring to Everest - The MAC 24 Hour Climbathon

Mount Aspiring College's Aspiring to Everest - 24 Hour Climbathon is happening this weekend! The detailed timetable of events is outlined overleaf. There are so many ways to get involved and we are asking all students to take part as all money raised will directly affect their learning opportunities here at school. All money raised will be used to purchase class sets of laptops, bringing ICT into the classroom.

All students have already received sponsorship booklets to request support from the community in their ambition to climb their goal. This isn't the only way to get involved though. With food which needs cooking and selling, setup and cleanup, and live music being played - any way in the students can help us out will be invaluable.

A couple of things in particular to draw your attention to are:

- A child and family friendly session on the Sunday morning with face painting, games and more...
- The organised Climbing Events (see timetable) where you can take part.
- Our climb to Everest – one central climb which is our combined effort to climb the height of Everest within the 24 hours.
- A shuttle service has been arranged to and from the main stage to Base Camp every half hour.
- The venue will be closed to the public from 11.00 pm until 7.00 am the next morning.

And lastly, but by no means least: **Wayne Bosley** will be on a porta-ledge for the **full 24 hours**.

Now this is BIG. A porta-ledge is a suspended living compartment for overnight rock climbing. There is not much space and 24 hours is a long time. To be humane, we'll give him breaks, but he believes he can survive on this ledge for the full 24 hours. It is a huge undertaking and something which has to be seen to be believed. If you want to sponsor his efforts we'll take money on the day or at the office here at school.

There is going to be something for everyone at this mammoth event so be sure to drop in over the weekend, grab a bite to eat, climb a wall or two, or take a full part in the events and competitions.

ROWING NEWS

Student Property

Skateboards and scooters may still be left stacked neatly at the office (although we have plans for installing lockable racks for these in the near future). Items of value and awkward shaped items can be left behind the office counter at the discretion of the office staff.

Tournament of Minds

On the last Friday of the term, 69 Year 7-10 MAC students headed down to Dunstan High School to take part in the annual T.O.M. competition. This is an Australasian programme for gifted students who select teams then spend six weeks working through a prescribed challenge of their choice, to produce a creative solution to the problem.

On the day teams have ten minutes to set up, deliver their performance to a panel of judges and vacate the stage. Points are given for creativity, team work and success in addressing the challenge and adhering to the parameters. Designed to encourage problem solving, team work, time management and creativity the weeks before TOM are filled with pressure as teams work to find solutions without adult help.

We had a wonderfully successful day. One of our Year 7 teams (Florence Cabillero-Collins, Nina Bowley, Kath Millis, Michaela Hawkins, Sydney Telfor and Sarah Crabbe) came first in the 'Applied Technology Challenge' and one of the Year 8 teams (Sophie Ray, Stefan Schwarz, Rachel Macpherson, Alannah Habershon, Grace Rose and Emma Jay) came first in the 'Language Literature Challenge' and were also the overall Year 7/8 winners.

The Year 9/10 teams also did fantastically well with one Year 10 team (Codey Tucker, Rosie Thomson, Connie Lloyd, Finlay Woods, Richard Macpherson and Courtney Poole) winning the 'Language Literature' section and another Year 10 team (Eleanor Merton, Ben Sherson, Eugene Wolfen, Samantha Barnett and Natalie Pearce) winning the 'Applied Technology Challenge'. This team were also the overall Year 9/10 winners.

A special mention should also be given to a year 8 MAC group who also achieved the highest score in the spontaneous challenge section. This was no mean feat as this year there were 33 teams of eight students from five different schools.

Two senior students Anna Hogg and Amy Kennerley used their past experiences at TOM to become judges this year and impressed their adult counterparts with their insights.

Maths Extension

Maths extension will also start this term, for selected students from Years 7-10. This is an opportunity for challenge in a small group with a specialist teacher.
