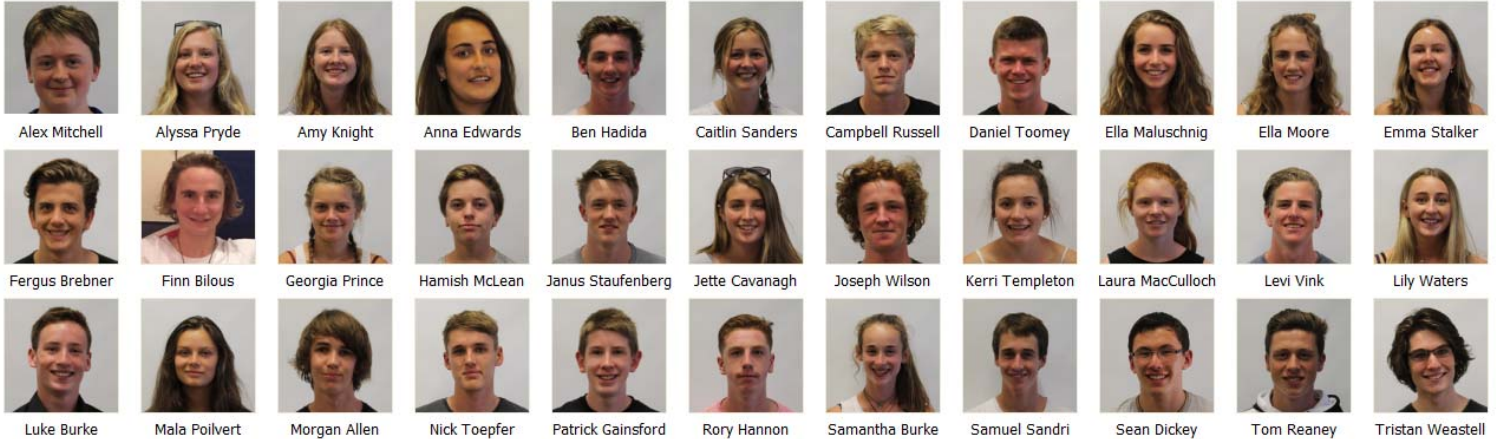

Changes to Fortnightly Reporting

I am writing to let you know that we have reviewed and refined our fortnightly reporting system. As you know this initiative was set up to provide students and parents with regular feedback about student progress and has worked very well indeed.

Reasons for Refinement

Feedback from parents suggests that you would prefer a simplified format where teachers provide feedback about students' attitude. We feel the word 'attitude' encompasses not only behaviour but other indicators like; respect, empathy, kindness, confidence, diligence, conscientious and being courteous. This also aligns nicely with MAC's core values SOAR (Self, Others, Attitude and Respect)

What it means for you

You will still receive a fortnightly report via the Parent Portal. This report will look similar to last year's except there will only be one indicator (Attitude) that is reported on and your student's attendance for each class will also be shown.

Student attitude will be given a mark out of 5 for each class and averaged across each fortnight. We expect that students will achieve at least 3.5 as an average across all classes each fortnight.

We think that this format will continue to deliver you with valuable feedback about student progress and provide conversation starters between yourselves and your student and or teachers.

Waterskiing Success

Meg Harraway has brought home a silver medal from the New Zealand Australia waterskiing championships which were held in Cambridge two weeks ago. Meg competed in the U14's, finishing second in the slalom and fourth in the jump which is a highly competitive field.

Meg followed this up with two wins (jump and slalom) and a second (trick) at the Canterbury 3 event last weekend. These results are even more impressive, as she was competing in a higher age group (U17) in order to gain more points for future team selections. Well done Meg!

A Second Medal for Finn!

Finn Bilous has earned his second Winter Youth Olympic Games medal in Lillehammer, Norway with a bronze in Freeski Slopestyle.

The freeski competition took place in the early hours of Saturday morning NZT meaning that Finn's medal performance falls on the same date in history – 20 February – on which Annelise Coberger won NZ's first and only Olympic Winter medal – silver in Slalom at the 1992 Games in France.

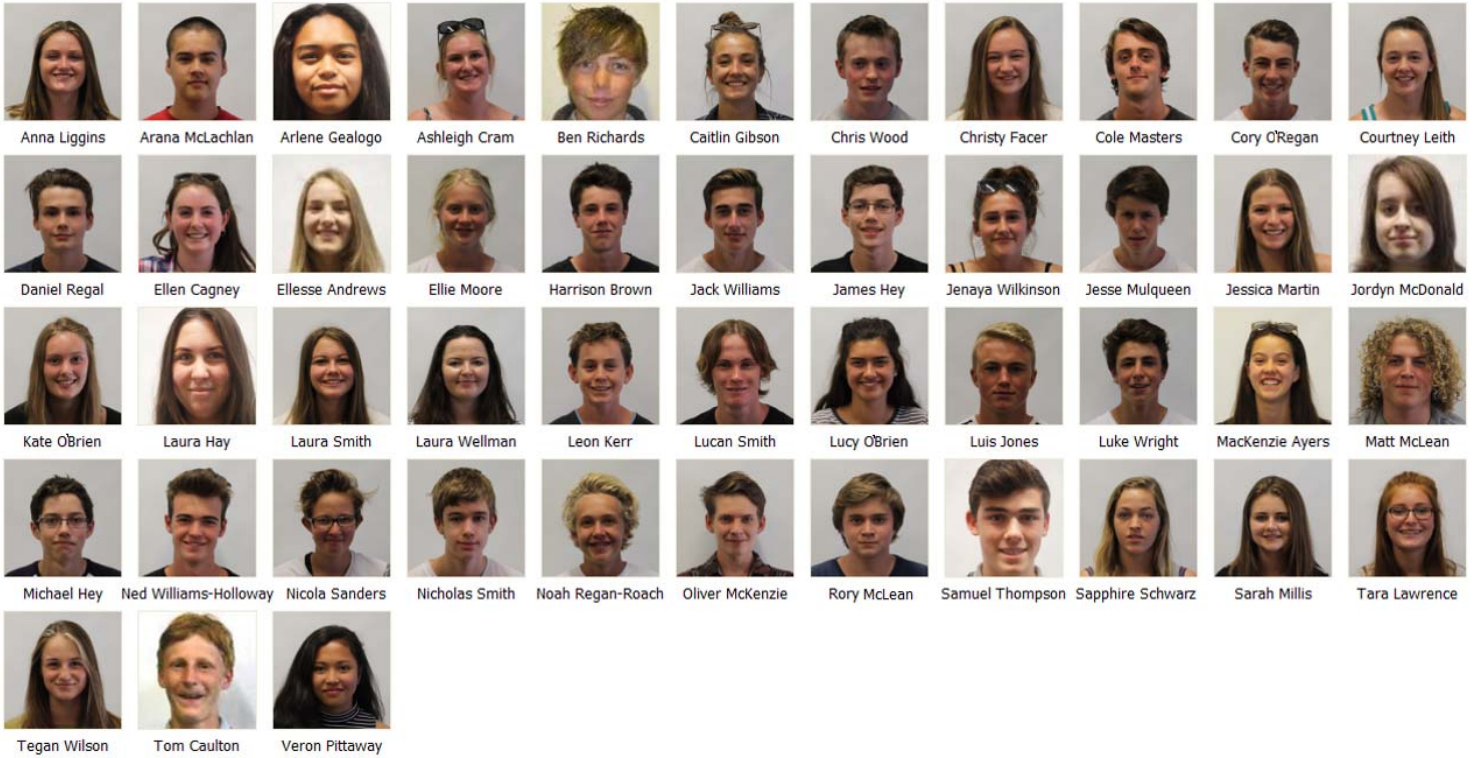

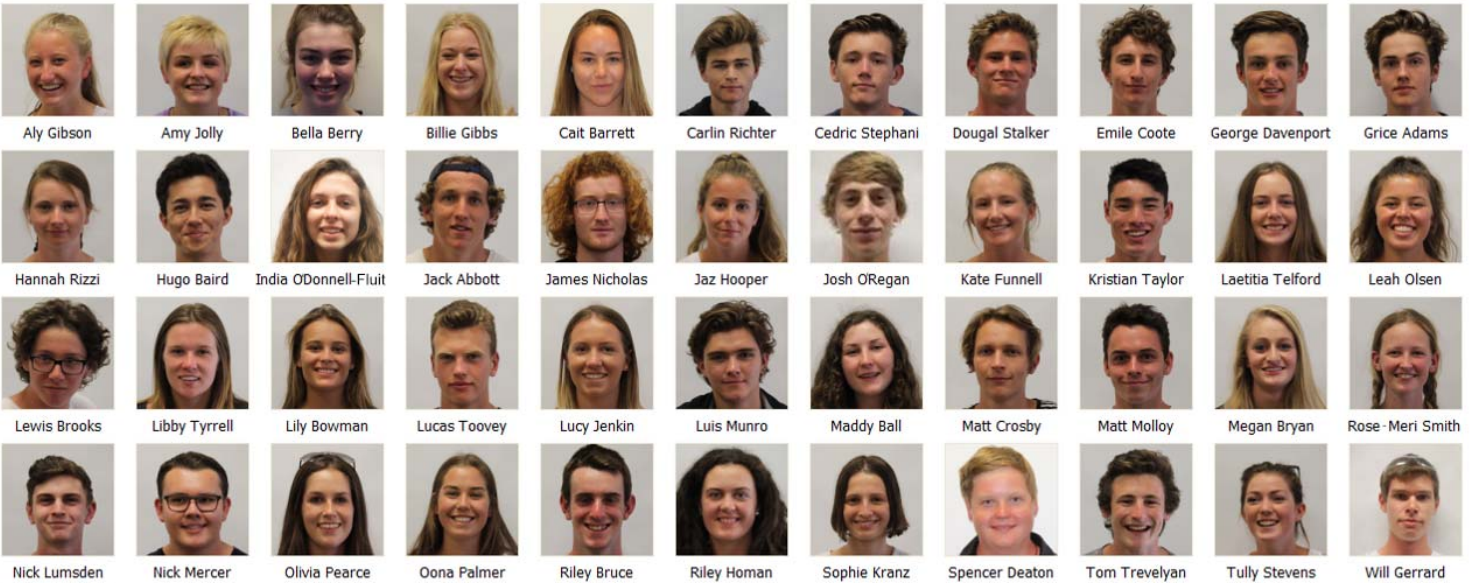
