This meet had over 400 competitors from many countries. It was four days long with heats in the morning and finals in the evening competing against all classifications.

Hamish was in the youth age group and did outstandingly well, receiving podium finishes for four events (1st in 200m Freestyle and 200m Individual Medley, 2nd in 100m Breaststroke and 3rd in 400m Freestyle) and PBs in all but one race. This has improved his world rankings.

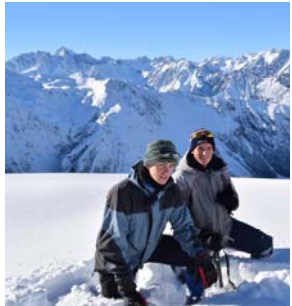
HQ Report - Horse Riding Success

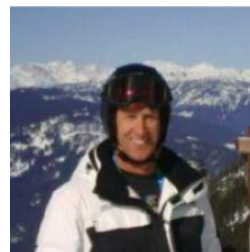
