It was the day we had all been waiting for. The journey started when we communicated with the kids in Kenya for One Heart Day.

A month later we started our path to trade day. Having sat through a lecture on the pro's and con's of selling food and crafts we were released to make groups and to decide what we would sell. We then had three hours every week to organise our stalls and sort out a business plan of what we were to be selling, buy our food, make the stuff and, most important of all, market our food to the junior school.

Finally the day had arrived. People taped up signs, fired up barbecues and mixed spiders. When the bell rang the first customers came swarming round the corner like a flock of birds diving down to kill their prey. Luckily, the grey rain had held off and the trade day was a bustling success. Half the stores sold out in the first twenty minutes and the rest by the end of lunch. By the end of the day our class had raised \$508 for the "So They Can" charity that supports over 6000 children in Kenya and Tanzania. That's enough for 101 children to have two meals a day for a month, and that's just from one small Year 8 class in the middle of New Zealand. So imagine the possibilities of every school doing the same thing.
